**POSITION & PROGRAM:** Speech and Language Pathologist/Early Intervention

**POSITION SUMMARY:** The Licensed Speech and Language Pathologist (SLP), in compliance with Ohio Board of Speech and Hearing Professionals and Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD) rules and regulations will provide evidence-based early intervention services for communication, language, speech and feeding development for infants and toddlers with developmental delays and disabilities.

The SLP will provide assessments of development, speech and language, and oral motor as well as assist families and the Early Intervention team with developing outcomes and strategies. The SLP works closely with other disciplines on the Early Intervention team, in the family's natural environment, to enhance the child's development and the family's abilities to be confident, competent caregivers.

As a contractor of the Miami County Board of Developmental Disabilities, the job incumbent shall always comply with all Board policies, and shall demonstrate respect for, support the dignity of, and observe the rights of all individuals served by the Board and demonstrate sensitivity to diverse beliefs, values and family structures.

### **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Must possess and maintain a license from the Ohio Board of Speech and Hearing Professionals and preferred Certificate of Clinical Competence
- Must have at least one (1) year paid work experience as a licensed Speech and Language Pathologist
- Must demonstrate ability to assess the needs of children birth to the age of three and families, develop and implement treatment plans, evaluate and document changes
- Must be responsible for safeguarding confidential information
- May be requested to lift, carry, and move children in a safe manner
- Must support the Family-Centered philosophy
- Strong oral and written communication
- Competency in Microsoft Office applications
- Ability to abide by Riverside's Code of Conduct
